









Prof Dr Kamran Ghoreschi

Professor Kamran Ghoreschi graduated from the medical school of the University of Munich (LMU) and trained in Dermatology and Allergy at the universities of Munich and Tübingen, Germany.

His doctoral thesis was on T cell immunology. From 2008 to 2011 he worked as a postdoctoral research fellow at the National Institutes of Health (NIH, NIAMS), Bethesda, USA. In 2011 he returned to the Department of Dermatology at the University of Tübingen, Germany, where he worked as senior physician and principle investigator of an immunological research unit.

Dr. Ghoreschi's habilitation thesis was on immunotherapies. In Tübingen he was appointed as a full professor for Dermatology, Allergology and Immunology in 2017. Since 2018 Professor Ghoreschi is director and chair of the Department of Dermatology, Venereology and Allergology at the Charité University Hospital in Berlin, Germany. His clinical and scientific interests are in immunodermatology. He enjoys teaching students in dermatology and basic immunology.

Professor Ghoreschi is principal investigator of a translational research unit, the Molecular Immunology Charité. His basic research focuses on T cell immunology, cytokine signaling and the molecular mechanisms of immunotherapies. He published innovative translational studies on the mechanisms of immunotherapeutics in psoriasis, on IL-23/Th17 cell biology and JAK/STAT signaling in immune cells. He is board member of the Germany Society of Dermatology (DDG) and the German STI Society (DSTIG) and member of the European Academy of Dermatology and Venereology (EADV), the European Society for Dermatological Research (ESDR) and the European Dermatology Forum (EDF).
